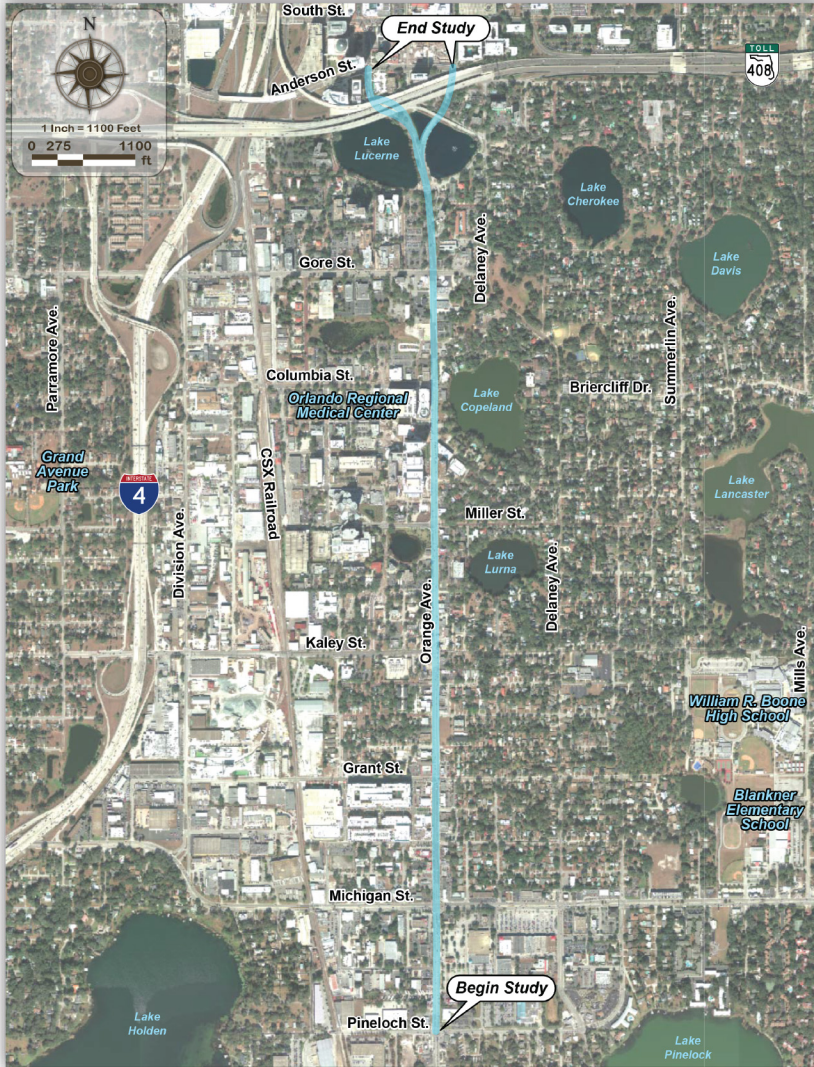


Orange Avenue

CORRIDOR PLANNING STUDY

NORTH SECTION: PINELOCH AVENUE TO ANDERSON STREET



STUDY PURPOSE

The purpose of this Corridor Planning Study is to develop a plan for future transportation infrastructure within the Orange Avenue Corridor just south of Downtown Orlando. The goals and objectives for the Study will be formed by the recommendations from similar planning initiatives like the Orange/Michigan Vision Plan, South Downtown Vision Plan, and the Orlando Health Plan. These initiatives considered urban form and design, setbacks, streetscaping, transportation goals, and strategies which can be incorporated into this project. The transportation planning process will identify a range of multi-modal solutions to provide for future mobility. This involves the consideration of land use, transportation, and infrastructure needs in accordance with the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT's) Transportation Design for Livable Communities policy.

Getting input from project stakeholders and community members is encouraged, and is a critical component of a successful project. The efforts undertaken by FDOT involve a collaborative effort which includes establishing a Project Visioning Team made up of community leaders, residents, and local agency staff. The goal of this team is to actively seek input into the planning process and promote awareness of design issues within the Orange Avenue corridor.

This project seeks to address the mobility needs of the community and advance the long term vision for the Orange Avenue corridor. The implementation strategy developed by this project will incorporate long-term policies and procedures in order to guide future development within the corridor. It will also identify improvements which can be advanced in the near term. Such improvements may be advanced through local agency participation and/or by FDOT as funding becomes available.
